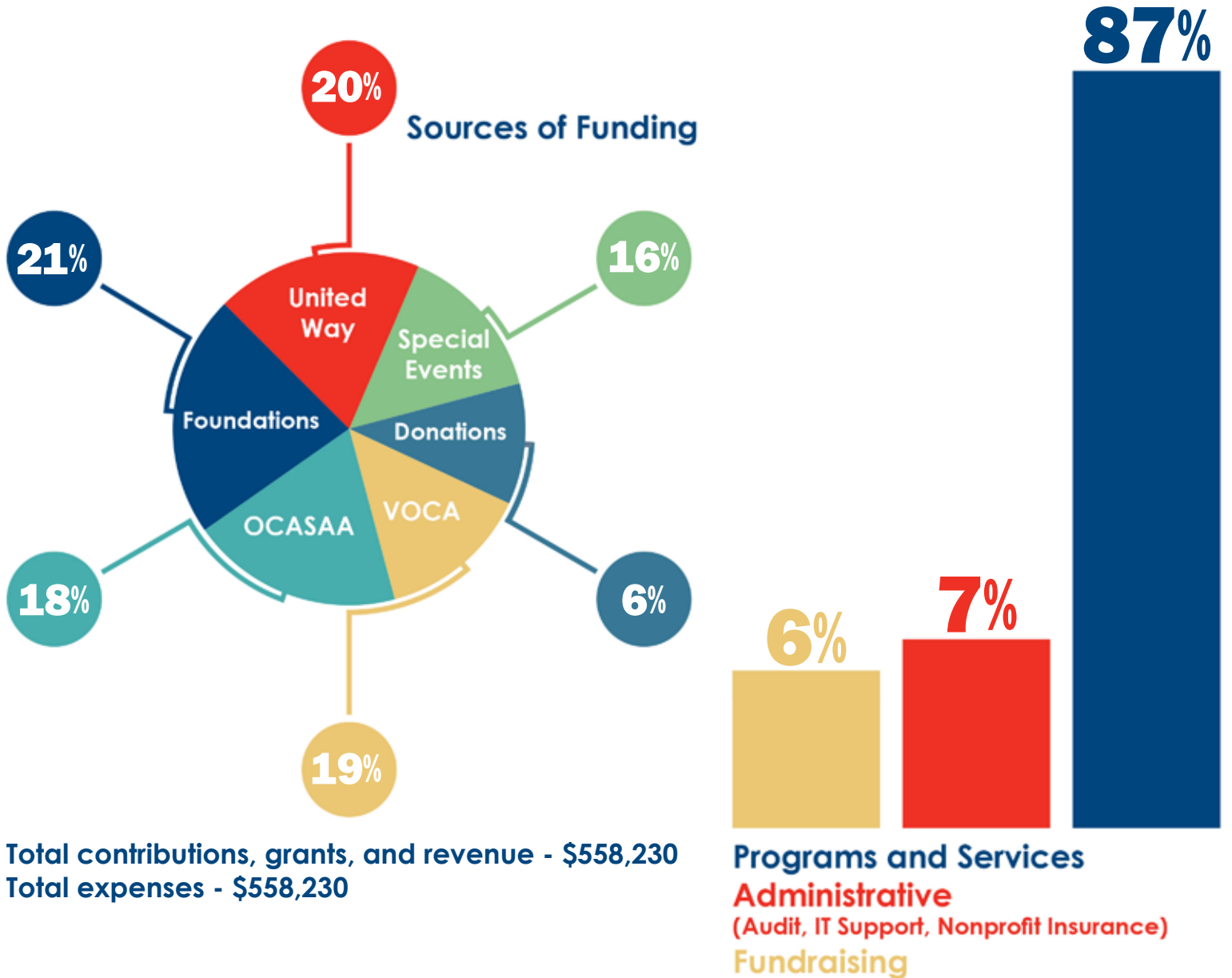

2016 Tulsa CASA Balance Sheet

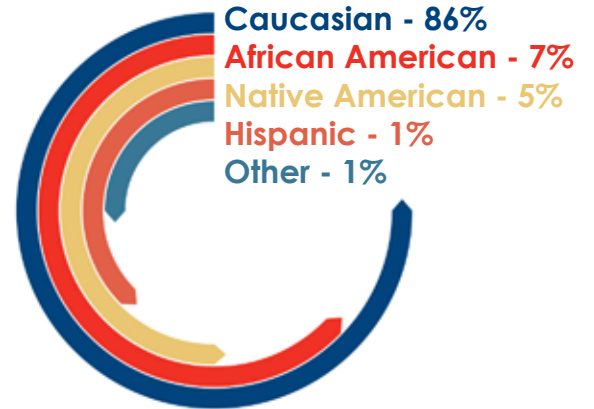
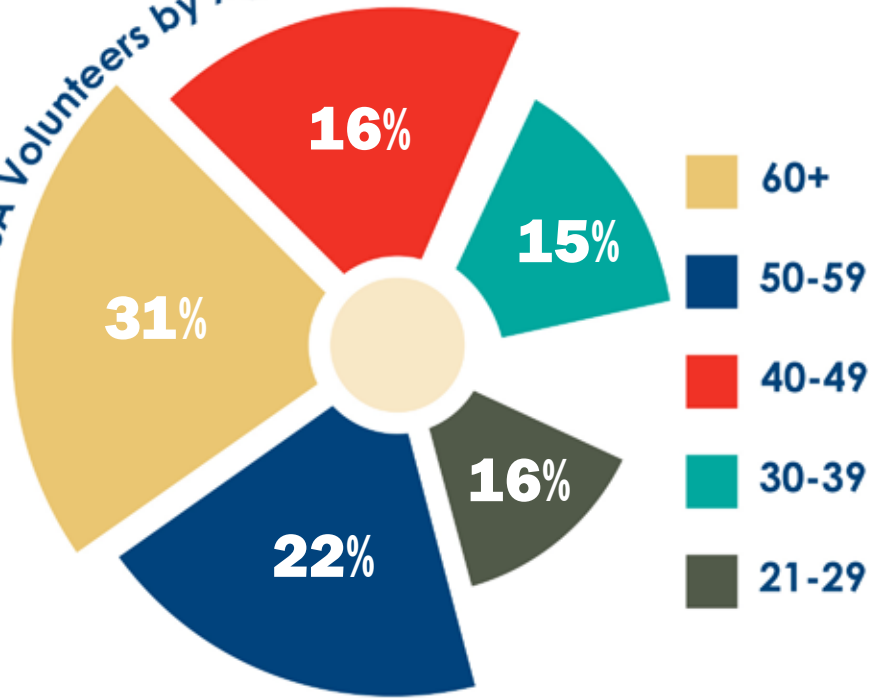

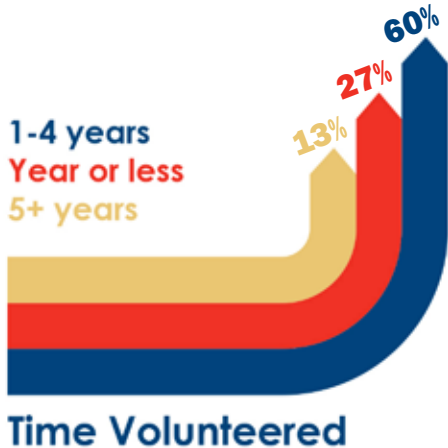
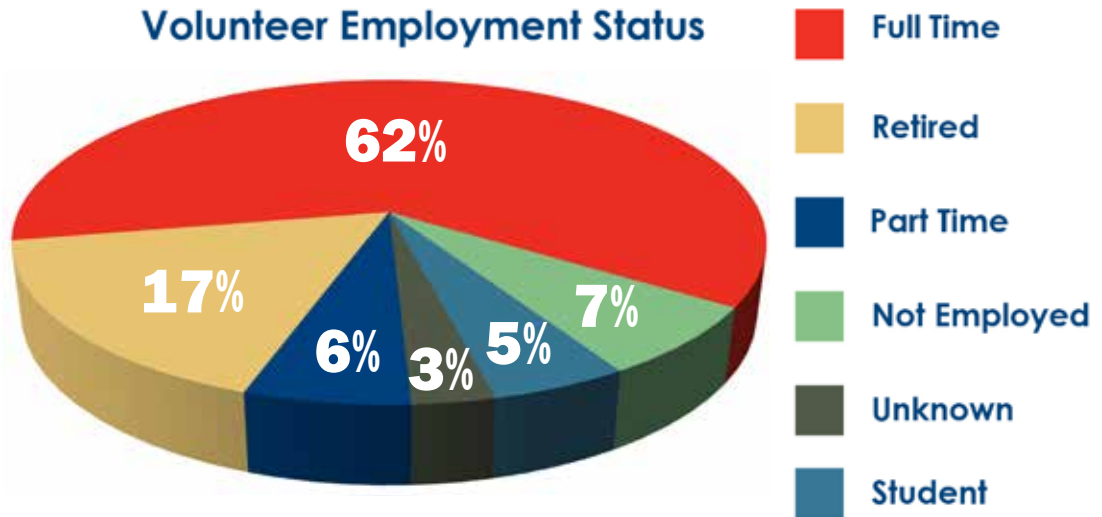

2016 Demographics of CASA Children

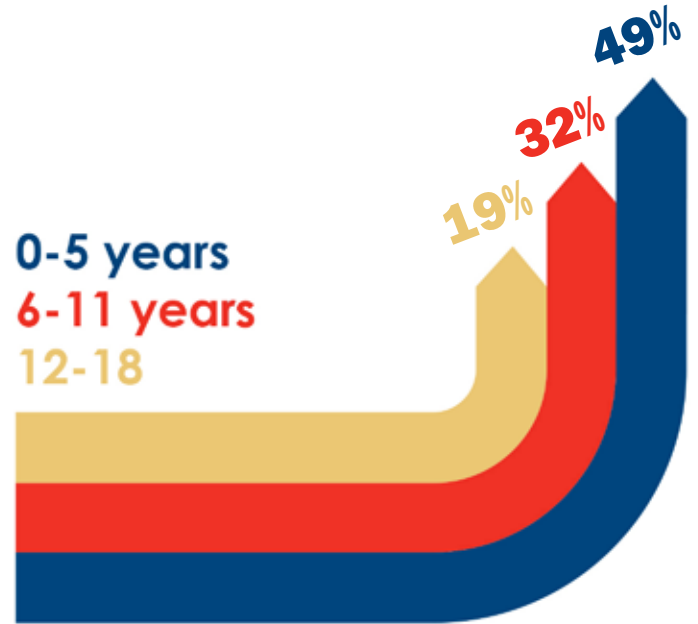

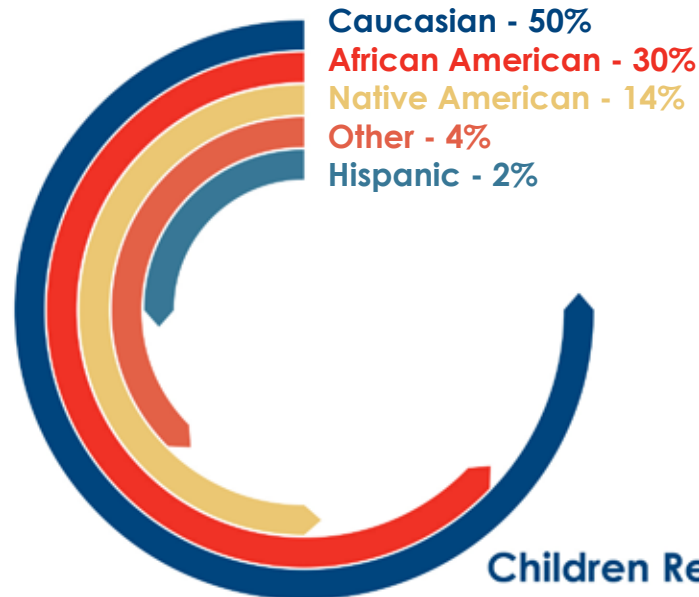
