LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



Tulsa CASA Friends & Supporters:

As I reflect on 2023, I am filled with a deep sense of pride for the journey past and enthusiasm for the journey ahead.

Similar to the children and families we serve, the lengthy path we have traveled out of the pandemic has been littered with obstacles. We saw children in state custody increase while our volunteers decreased. We saw parents and children and siblings struggle to get the services, visitation and stable placements needed. We saw the kindness, resourcefulness and collaboration of colleagues and community partners as we all worked on behalf of state involved families and children to keep them safe and secure in our community. We saw our volunteers eagerly tread difficult and unknown terrain for children who were first strangers and then a priority to them. The overarching goal of Tulsa CASA is to provide quality advocacy to every child in foster care in our community. Tulsa County Juvenile Deprived Court saw 1,600 abused and/or neglected children in 2023. Tulsa CASA was able to advocate for 205 of those children.

Having a CASA volunteer means having a consistent, stable adult for a child during a difficult and unfamiliar time. In 2023, the 197 children served by Tulsa CASA saw 788 professional changes. Of those changes; 359 were caseworker changes, over a hundred were attorney changes, and only 24 were CASA changes.




AGE



GENDER




RACE/ETHNICITY




VOLUNTEER DEMOGRAPHICS


AGE



GENDER




RACE/ETHNICITY


